
RCRW Book Club -

Be sure to mark your calendars now and join us for the next discussion.







Thanksgiving Left over casserole recipe

Ingredients:

- 4 cups seasoned stuffing cubes
- 4 cups cubed cooked turkey
- 2 celery ribs, finely chopped
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1 cup fresh or frozen cranberries
- 1/2 cup chopped sweet onion
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 4 large eggs
- 3 cups 2% milk
- 1 can (8-1/4 ounces) cream-style corn
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/3 cup coarsely chopped pecans



Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° Layer first 6 ingredients in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. In a large bowl, whisk flour, eggs and milk until smooth. Add corn, salt and pepper; mix well. Pour over top; let stand 15 minutes. Dot with butter and sprinkle with pecans.
- 2. Cover and bake 35 minutes. Uncover and bake 30-35 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean.

TEXAS STATE SENATE DISTRICT 2

The unborn do not remain forever unborn.

Protecting those who cannot protect themselves is one of the primary roles of government, and no one is more incapable of protecting themselves than the unborn.

A few months ago, I submitted a request to the Lt. Governor to have the Senate Committee on Health and Human Services conduct a study during the 87th on the current state-funded programs and services offered to expecting and new parents in Texas, including the alternatives to abortion program. In addition, I requested the committee make recommendations for how the Texas Legislature could support mothers, especially if Roe v. Wade was overturned or reversed. I am pleased that the Lt. Governor included some of these items in his charge to the Senate Committee on State Affairs. This charge specifically states that this committee should "(m)onitor the impact of Senate Bill 8, The Texas Heartbeat Act, and the expanded funding for alternatives to abortion programs passed by

the 87th Legislature. Study alternatives to abortion programs' effectiveness in meeting the needs of pregnant and postpartum women and recommend how the Legislature should strengthen the program. Recommend ways to provide additional alternatives to abortion and comprehensive informed consent resources to mothers who are expecting."

It was a timely request. With the ruling by the Supreme Courts on Roe v. Wade that decisions regarding the legality of abortions is once again be left to the states, it is crucial that Texas be prepared to respond to the needs of expecting and new parents.

The unborn do not remain forever unborn. Therefore, it is crucial that the legislature be exceedingly vigilant to not pass any legislation that would impede the care of, and support for, new parents or the newborn.

One area that can be improved, specifically relating to the alternatives to abortion program, would be the expansion of these programs to additional areas of the state and implementing some way to measure success of these programs. If the intention is to provide "alternatives" to abortion, it is imperative that we know how well we are doing at achieving this goal.

There are many aspects of this issue that could be addressed and there are still problems that we need to solve, but at least Texas is on the right track.

WOMEN HEROINES OF WORLD WAR II

Many brave men fought for our freedom during several wars, including World War II. But there were many brave women heroines as well. During this month when we are honoring our veterans, I'd like to tell you about a few of these brave women.

RUBY BRADLEY

Ruby Bradley was an Army nurse in the Philippines when Pearl Harbor was attacked by the Japanese. When the Japanese invaded Luzon, Ruby and another nurse tried to escape to the hills nearby but were turned into the Japanese by Filipinos wanting favorable treatment.

Bradley and other nurses were incarcerated in a prison camp for three years. They performed surgeries and other medical services while imprisoned. When liberated Bradley only weighed 84 pounds. She later earned a bachelor's degree, continuing as an Army nurse and serving in the Korean War. Bradley was one of the most decorated women in the U.S. Army history and was buried with honor in 2002 in Arlington National Cemetery, after she died at age 94.

JACQUELINE COCHRAN

From Georgia, Jacqueline Cochran gained her commercial pilot's license in 1936 in just three weeks. She earned many medals in air races

Cochran trained many pilots during the war, earning the U.S. Distinguished Service Medal in 1945. She broke many flight records and was the first woman to break the sound barrier in 1953. She was the first woman inducted into the Aviation Hall of Fame in 1971.

HEDY LAMARR

Hedy Lamarr, an Austrian immigrant and famous movie star, along with composer George Antheil, created a radio guidance system for Allied torpedoes. This system prevented the jamming of torpedoes' frequency hopping and helped prevent enemy detection of the torpedoes' locations. This system was a forerunner to Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and missile guidance systems. Lamarr was honored by receiving the Electronic Frontier Foundation Pioneer Award in 1997, and was posthumously inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame in 2014.

ALEDA LUTZ

Aleda Lutz, the daughter of German immigrants, enlisted in the Army Nurse Corps in 1942. She eventually volunteered as an air nurse, so she could give her service overseas. She had to pass a rigorous physical to become an air nurse but did so, because she had been an athlete before the war.

Lutz flew into combat zones in Africa, Italy, and France. All of the 3500 men assigned to her care survived. Sadly though, the plane carrying Lutz, nine other GI's, and six German POW's crashed in France in 1944 because of bad weather. Lutz was the first American woman to die in combat and was highly decorated.

These four women are just a few examples of brave women who helped the United States in its efforts during World War II. Let's honor all of our veterans this Veterans Day and every day!
